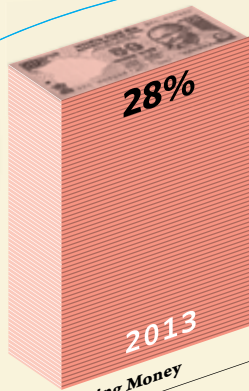

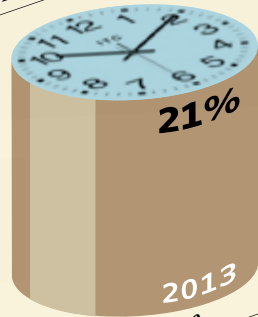
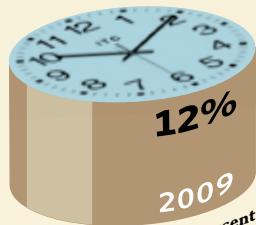

Percentage of Indians Giving Money

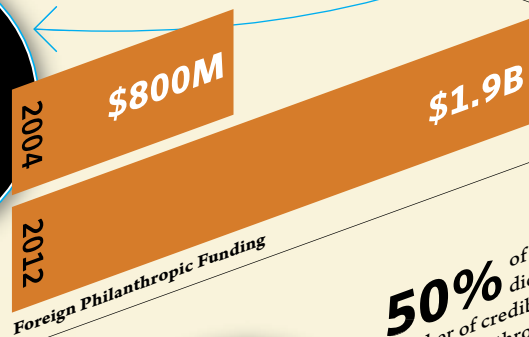


Percentage of Indians Giving Time

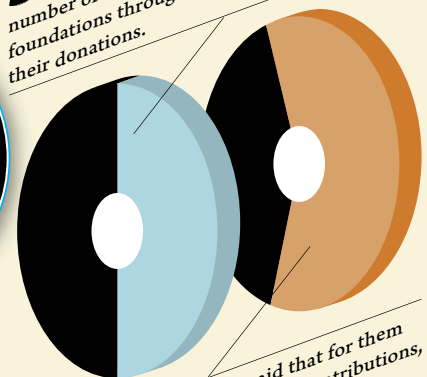
